Burrowing Crayfish - Anatomy What does it look like?

A Burrowing Crayfish is a type of land Crayfish, which lives in burrows in grassy wet paddocks or freshwater meadows. The Burrowing Crayfish is a nocturnal Creature making it active at night.

Appearance:

- ✓ They are brown in colour.
- ✓ They are 8-15Cm long.
- ✓ The 2 large claws help build and maintain burrows.
- ✓ The claws are used to defend it from <u>predators</u>.
- ✓ The small tail allows it live life underground.
- ✓ It is a <u>Crustacean</u> an animal with a hard outer body (<u>Carapace</u> or exoskeleton).
- ✓ It is a decapod (meaning it has 10 limbs) 8 legs and 2 claws.
- ✓ It has antennae and 2 eyes.
- ✓ It has 2 small feeding arms used to eat <u>decaying</u> plant and animal material.
